Dear Parents and Carers,

I'm writing this on a blustery evening in February with the news that the UK is about to be devastated by Storm Eunice. I am hopeful that it passes us by, mainly because I'm not sure our little school can take much more of a battering! This term Covid, heating, transport, trees and generators have all done their best to bring us down, but I am delighted to say we are still standing... just!

I attended a meeting earlier this week that covered attendance and learnt that this term, Birmingham schools were more adversely affected by Covid than the rest of the UK. I am sure that you and your children/young people have all felt that, with continuous requests to complete Lateral Flows, isolate and regular classroom closures. As this half term draws to an end, we seem to have stabilised our infection rates with only one class closure this week. Advice from Public Health is that this trend will continue into the spring.

Despite that good news, this week has brought about additional challenges with a significant fuel leak on the Woodlands site. Monday morning brought the news that 1500 litres of red diesel had leaked from our emergency generator. I can't tell you how devasted we were to see the pollution run across the car park and into the Forest School and Pond. Gaynor and Amy (our Forest School Leaders) were faced with a bleak recovery and rebuild. As the week has gone on, we have learnt more about the impact and the plan for recovery, assisted by our partners at Birmingham City Council and Environmental Services. I am pleased to say that all is not lost at Forest School and I'm hopeful that we will see the pond filled with wildlife soon. Thankfully our resident badgers were unharmed. We will be bringing videos and photos of their wanderings over the next term as our newly installed night time videos show us all their spring activities, well... maybe not all of their activities.



In class Osbourne we are taking turns in Leisure, playing games and having sensory engagement sessions.















KS3 Knight really enjoy our calming sensory session on a Friday afternoon, winding down from a week of fabulous work.






#### KS3WT Zephaniah





#### **School Meals**

When your child first starts at Uffculme School, we ask what their meal booking pattern will be. Over time, your child's requirements may change. If you would like to change your child's meal booking pattern please email enquiry@uffculme.bham.sch.uk and include the following information:

- Your child's name
- The new meal booking pattern for each day
- The date you would like this to start from (please allow 24 hours' notice for any changes)

All payments for school meals must be made on ParentPay **in advance**. If you require any support with ParentPay or require your activation details, please contact the school office.

If your child may be eligible for free school meals you can complete an online check: <u>https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham (</u>link on school website). You will receive an instant decision and the school will also be notified of the outcome by email. You only need to apply once, if your eligibility changes since the initial application school will be notified automatically.

<u>Children in reception class that are of compulsory school age, until the end of year 2</u> <u>are currently entitled to universal free school meals.</u> When your child moves into year 3 you will be charged for school meals unless your child is eligible for free school meals or you make any changes to your child's meal booking pattern before then.

#### MARCH – APRIL 2022 – On a WEDNESDAY, 6pm – 9pm


