

Year 11 Examinations and Awards 2022

After two years of disruption due to Covid, examination courses ran almost as normal this year. There were 13 students in our main Year 11 pathway. 10 of these studied at our Chamberlain site and three at Russell Road.

KS4 main students - Chamberlain

There were 10 Year 11 main students in our main class at our Chamberlain site. They followed predominately Entry level courses across three subjects (English, Mathematics and Science). Two students gained accreditation in Open College Network courses in English and Science.

One of these Year 11 Chamberlain students was entered for GCSE Mathematics and GCSE English.

KS4 main students - Russell Road

There were three Year 11 main students at Russell Road. These students followed a tailored vocational curriculum. One of these students did not gain any accreditation at the end of Year 11 largely due to attendance and engagement issues. The other two students achieved qualifications in English (Entry 3), Maths and Science (Level 1), Arts Award and a Riding and Animal Care accreditation from the British Horse Society.

Altogether, eleven of our Year 11 main students achieved the Bronze level Arts Award.

KS4 Transition/ complex students

There were eight students in our extended classes. Three of these students were taught at our Chamberlain site and five at Russell Road.

Of the three students at Chamberlain, two followed the ASDAN Transition Challenge (School Award) course completing activities successfully. One student followed a more personalised sensory curriculum without accreditation.

Of the five students taught at Russell Road, four achieved an Entry 1 qualification in Independent Living. One student did not achieve an accreditation.

Year 11 Progress – Main students

English

11 main students gained an English Entry level (OCN or AQA) accreditation. We did not have KS2 data for one of these students. One student sat the GCSE English Language exam. One main student did not gain an accreditation in English.

Art Awards

Eleven main students achieved Arts Award Bronze which is a level 1 qualification demonstrating excellent progress from their KS2 levels.

Year 11 Progress - KS4 Transition/ complex students

Two of our three KS4 extended students at Chamberlain made progress in relation to development of life skills through participation in the Transition Challenge programme. As noted above, one student did not follow the Transition Challenge course but experienced a more sensory-based curriculum.

Of the five students taught at Russell Road, four achieved an Entry 1 qualification in Independent Living indicating very good progress from secondary starting points (P6 or P7). One student did not achieve an accreditation.
