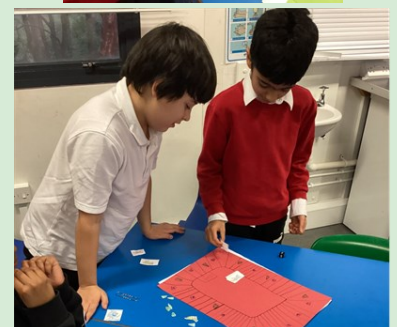

On Monday 11th December Santa came to visit and the children came to see him in his grotto. The children found it really exciting and loved the experience.

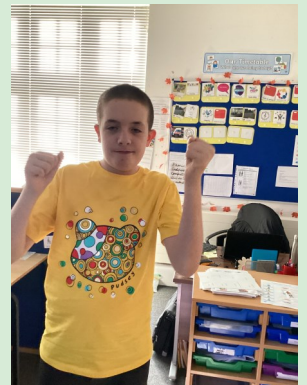


# Autumn 2023

This term Darby class have had the focus around 'People who Help Us'. This has included learning and focusing on a range of professions including Nurses, Firefighters, Teachers, Police and Doctors. We have been learning what they do to help, what uniforms they wear and how they protect us within the community.

The Local Community Police have visited to give a talk around how they help us, protect us and the different equipment they use .

We have regular visits out into the community as part of the Transition Curriculum and have been working towards NEW ASDAN qualifications in English, Maths as well as accessing community experiences that include visiting the shops, Highbury Park, Local cafes (all focused on building life skills/independence out in the community).



Mead have been working hard on their maths work this term. We have been looking at addition and breaking it down to partitioning , number bonds and understanding how to write a maths sentence. They then applied this in our independence skills lesson where we went shopping to Sainsburys at the Maypole and added up coins to pay for our items.



Boulton class held a tea-party with a Halloween theme for our friends from Russell Road. We enjoyed it so much, we will be repeating it with a Christmas theme for our parents and family members.

This term Priestly class have been out and about in the local community looking at the different types of jobs that people do.

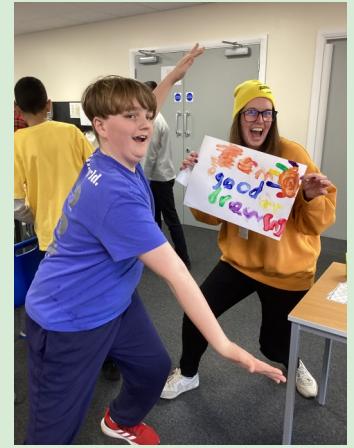
We have walked up Kings Heath High Street looking at the different skills people need for various jobs - such as working in the police station, nail salon, cafe, supermarket and gym.

We have enjoyed weekly walks through Highbury Park and students have loved feeding the ducks at the pond.

We also run a weekly cafe in class 'The Priestly Cafe' where students all take on a job role to make breakfast for everyone.

This half term Cadbury class have been very busy indeed! In English we've been learning about different writing styles including Traditional Tales, Myths & Legends and Science Fiction stories. We've looked closely at what is included in each type of story and worked hard to include these in our own writing.

For Children in Need, we had a lovely afternoon focusing on what makes ourselves and each other "SPOTACULAR". Everyone had to write one nice thing about every pupil in the class, Miss Rowley then collected these all in and read each of the compliments out to each pupil. It was really lovely to sit and read all the nice things their classmates had said about them and it was lovely for that person to hear too. Then, we did some finger painting to make a lovely poster about what makes US SPOTACULAR. So we wrote the things we were good at and had a really lovely afternoon.



Our half term focus is COMMUNITY so we took a trip out to the local community and visited the New Life Baptist Church on the High Street. The Church visit also linked to our RE topic of 'Jesus Christ and Christianity' and pupils were able to ask lots of questions to help further their learning on this topic. 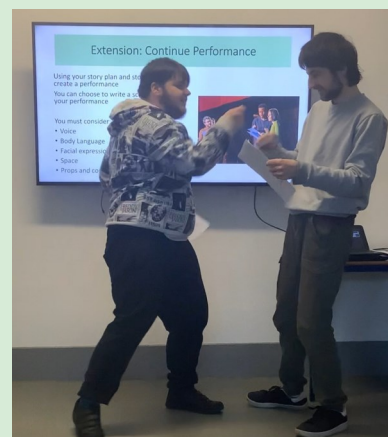
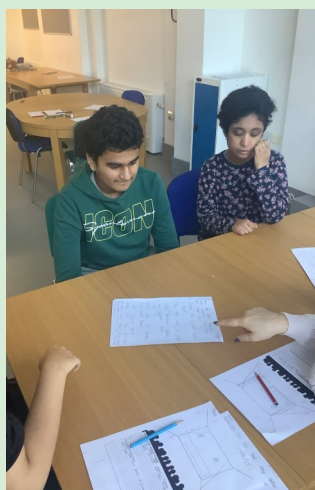
It's been a very busy term in Zephaniah!

## School Meals

When your child first starts at Uffculme School, we ask what their meal booking pattern will be. Over time, your child's requirements may change. If you would like to change your child's meal booking pattern please email [enquiry@uffculme.bham.sch.uk](mailto:enquiry@uffculme.bham.sch.uk) and include the following information:

Your child's name

The new meal booking pattern for each day of the week

The date you would like this to start from (please allow 24 hours' notice for any changes)

All payments for school meals must be made on ParentPay in advance. If you require any support with ParentPay or require your activation details, please contact the school office.

If your child may be eligible for free school meals you can complete an online check: <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims/> (link on school website). You will receive an instant decision and the school will also be notified of the outcome by email. You only need to apply once, if your eligibility changes since the initial application school will be notified automatically.

Children in reception class that are of compulsory school age, until the end of year 2 are currently entitled to universal free school meals. When your child moves into year 3 you will be charged for school meals unless your child is eligible for free school meals or you make any changes to your child's meal booking pattern before then.

If you have any queries regarding school meals, please contact the school office.
