The school has grown significantly over the last seven years, and we currently cater for over 300 children over three sites.

Over the past few years, we have developed Outdoor Learning and Forest School provisions which have become a critical part of our school curriculum. We maximise the use of local assets including Cannon Hill Park, Highbury Park, local allotments, Botanicals Gardens, the Lickey Hills, as well as venturing further afield.
